


# Highlights from 2017

- In 2017, Hands Across the Water launched its Yoga for Youth project, which provides trauma-sensitive yoga instruction to youth who have experienced foster care or adoption. These lessons are provided at no cost to the families and are generously funded by the Michigan Health Endowment Fund.
- With the support of Galen's Medical Society and Monroe Community Foundation G.R.O.W. Fund, Hands Across the Water opened a Youth Enrichment Fund in 2017. This fund awards grants from \$200-\$250 to Washtenaw and Monroe county youth in foster care to pursue enrichment activities, such as camp, art lessons, or educational trips.
- Hands Across the Water was recognized as a "Leader in Supporting and Serving LGBTQ Youth and Families" by the Human Rights Campaign (HRC) for the sixth year in a row, one of only two agencies in the state with this designation.
- The Council on Accreditation (COA) granted Hands Across the Water renewed Hague accreditation through 2022 with extremely high ratings of all "1" and "2" ratings - "1" for full compliance in 104 standards and a "2" rating for substantial compliance for 3 standards.
